KNOW YE. That We, of Our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do, by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

John Let Blane his heirs and assigns
a tract of Land situate in the Parish of
Carlton in the County of Kent in our province
of New Brunswick and bounded as follows
to wit. Beginning at a first tree standing
at the southwesterly angle of lot number
thirty two purchased by Levi Maulet in
Academy three north eighty six degrees
and thirty minutes west twelve Chains and
fifty links to a beech tree thence north three
degrees and thirty minutes east eight chains
thence South eighty six degrees and thirty
minutes east twelve Chains and fifty
links and thence South three degrees
and thirty minutes west eight chains
to the place of beginning containing One
Hundred acres more or less and distin-
guished as lot number thirty one in Academy

and also particularly described and marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments, and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining; except and reserved; nevertheless, out of this present Grant, to Us, Our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land,

and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances, (except before excepted), unto the said

John Let Blane his heirs and assigns FOR EVER.
