

QUEEN, Defender of the Faith, &c. To all to whom these Presents shall come. Greeting:

KNOW YE, That We, of Our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and
granted, and We do, by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

Fidel Daigle his heirs and assigns
a tract of land situated in the parish
of Carlton in the County of Kent in our
Province of New Brunswick and bounded
as follows to wit:- Beginning at a tree
standing at the southwesterly angle of lot
number forty-four purchased by Joseph
Hebert in Acaderville thence north three
degrees and thirty minutes east sixty-six
Chains and eighty links thence north eighty
six degrees and thirty minutes west fifteen
Chains thence south three degrees and thirty
minutes west sixty-six chains and eighty
links to a spruce tree and thence south eighty
six degrees and thirty minutes east fifteen
Chains to the place of beginning Containing
One Hundred acres more or less, and
distinguished as lot number forty-four
Acaderville



and also particularly described and marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits,
commodities, hereditaments, and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining; except
and reserved, nevertheless, out of this present Grant, to Us, Our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold
and Silver, and other Minerals: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said ~~tract~~ of Land,

and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurteances, (except before excepted), unto the said
Fidel Daigle his heirs and assigns FOR EVER.

PROVIDED always, and this present Grant is upon condition, that the same Grant be registered in the Secretary's
Office of Our said Province of New Brunswick; to which Registry shall be attached a duplicate of the Plan hereunto
annexed.
