Arno Brown his Heirs and Assigns,
a Tract of Land situate in the Parish of *Acadewille*
in the County of *Kent* in Our Province
of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:—

Beginning at a Spruce tree standing on the southwestern side of a reserved road at the most northern angle of lot number fifty five in the north Branch of Mc Lenn's Brook in Acadewille Settlement, thence running by the Magnet South twenty degrees and thirty minutes west fifty Chains, thence north sixty nine degrees and thirty minutes west twenty Chains, thence north twenty degrees and thirty minutes east fifty Chains to a maple tree standing on the south western side of the above mentioned reserved road and thence along the same south sixty nine degrees and thirty minutes east twenty Chains to the place of beginning containing One Hundred acres more or less and distinguished as lot number fifty Seven in Acadewille Settlement

in the County of Kent in Our Province
of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to-wit:-

Beginning at a Spruce tree standing on the south west side of a reserved road at the north west corner of lot number ninety four granted to Antoine Shebaw in Aeaduville settlement thence running by the enaquet south three degrees and thirty minutes west fifty nine chains to the north easterly bank or shore of the Nouchie-bouguac River thence along the same following the various courses thereof in a north westerly and south westerly direction up stream with a rectangular distance of nineteen chains and fifty links thence north three degrees and thirty minutes east fifty seven chains to a cedar tree standing on the southern side of the above mentioned reserved road and thence along the same south eighty six degrees and thirty minutes east nineteen chains and fifty links to the place of beginning containing one hundred acres more or less and distinguished as lot number ninety five in Aeaduville settlement
