Victoria, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, QUEEN, Defender of the Faith, &c. To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting :

KNOW YE. That We, of Our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do, by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto George McLeod his Heirs and Assigns,

two Tracts of Land situate in the Parish of Acaduville in the County of Kent

of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:

The First Tract. Beginning at a stake standing on the northern side of a reserved road at the south west angle of lot number forty four in Caie Settlement east of the Inter-Colonial Railway thence running by the magnet along the northern side of the said reserved road, north eighty seven degrees west thirty four Chains to a stake standing on the eastern side of another reserved road thence along the same north three degrees east sixty chains to a hemlock tree standing on the southern bank or shore of Kouchibouguac River thence along the same following the various courses thereof in an easterly direction down stream with a rectangular distance of thirty four Chains and thence south three degrees west sixty three Chains to the place of beginning containing two hundred acres more or less and distinguished as the First Tract lots numbers forty and forty two in Caie Settlement The Second Tract Beginning at a hemlock tree standing on the northern side of a reserved road at the southwest angle of lot number fifty two in Caie Settlement thence running by the magnet along the said reserved road north eighty seven degrees west fifty one Chains to a stake thence north three degrees east sixty three chains to the southern bank or shore of Kouchibouguac River thence along the same following the various courses thereof down stream in an easterly direction with a rectangular distance of fifty one chains and thence south three degrees west sixty three chains to the place of beginning containing three hundred acres more or less and distinguished as the Second Tract lots numbers forty one, forty eight and fifty in Caie Settlement. The two Tracts contain together five hundred acres more or less

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining; except and reserved, nevertheless, out of this Present Grant, to Us, Our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances, (except before excepted) unto the said George McLeod his Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER.

PROVIDED ALWAYS, and this present Grant is upon condition, that the same Grant be registered in the Secretary's Office of Our said Province of New Brunswick, to which Registry shall be attached a Duplicate of the Plan hereunto annexed.

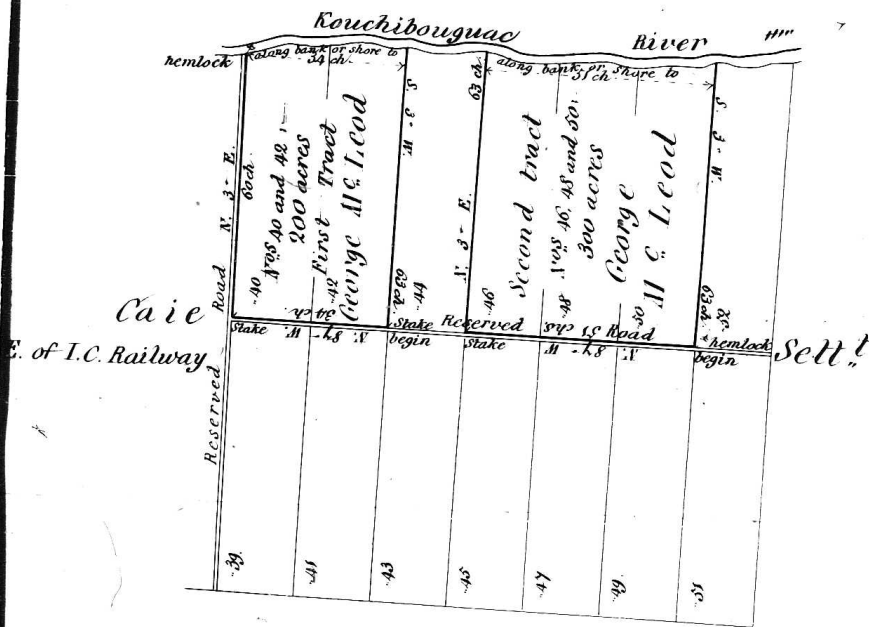
