Victoria, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland,
QUEEN, Defender of the Faith, &c. To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE. That We, of Our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do, by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

Dominique Poirier his Heirs and Assigns,
two Tracts of Land situate in the Parish of Aceduville
in the County of Kent in Our Province
of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:

The First Tract Beginning
at a stake standing on the eastern side of a reserved road at the southwest angle
of lot number seventy three granted to Andrew Martin in Aceduville settle-
ment thence running by the magnet south sixty nine degrees and thirty minutes
east fifty chains thence south twenty degrees and thirty minutes west twenty chains
thence north sixty nine degrees and thirty minutes west fifty chains to another
stake standing on the eastern side of aforesaid reserved road and thence
along the same north twenty degrees and thirty minutes east twenty
chains to the place of beginning containing One Hundred aces more
or less and distinguished as the First Tract. Lot number seventy five
in Aceduville Settlement. The Second Tract Beginning at a
stake standing at the northeast angle of lot number forty four purchased
by Joseph Herbert in Aceduville Settlement thence running by the magnet
north three degrees and twenty minutes east forty four chains to another
stake thence north sixty nine degrees and thirty minutes west twenty
two chains and sixty five links to another stake thence south three degrees
and twenty minutes west fifty chains to another stake and thence south eight
six degrees and forty minutes east twenty one chains and fifty links to the
place of beginning containing one Hundred aces more or less and dis-
tinguished as the Second Tract lot number two hundred in Aceduville
Settlement. The two tracts containing together two Hundred aces
more or less

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits,
commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining; except
and reserved, nevertheless, out of this Present Grant, to Us, Our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold
and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land,
and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances, (except before excepted) unto the said
Dominique Poirier his Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER.
PROVIDED ALWAYS, and this present Grant is upon condition, that the same Grant be registered in the Secretary's
Office of Our said Province of New Brunswick, to which Registry shall be attached a Duplicate of the Plan hereunto
annexed.

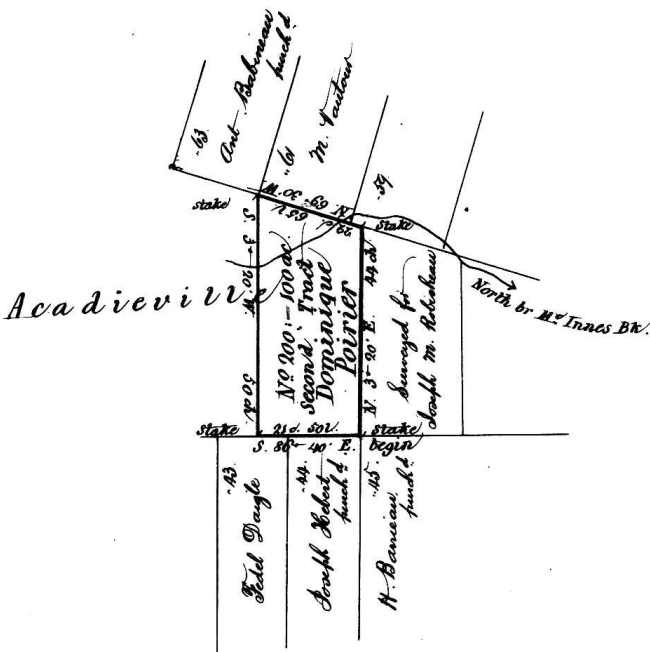
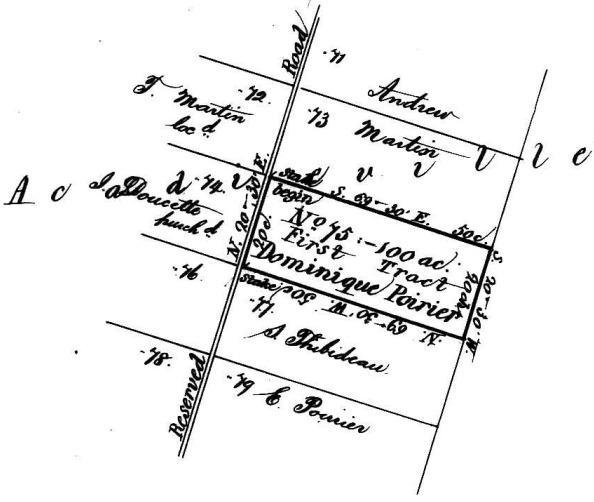
