Victoria, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland,  
QUEEN, Defender of the Faith, &c. To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting :

KNOW YE, That We, of Our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do, by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

Federick Johnson his Heirs and Assigns,  
a Tract of Land situate in the Parish of Aeadwille  
in the County of Kent in Our Province  
of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:—

Beginning at a stake standing on the western side of the Antirecolonial Railway and Reservation at the south east angle of Lot number One Hundred and Eleven purchased by John Deas. North of Kouchibouguac River thence running by the magnet South eighty two degrees and forty minutes west sixty seven Chains to another stake thence south seven degrees and thirty minutes east fifteen Chains to another stake standing on the northern side of a reserved road thence along the same north eighty two degrees and forty minutes east sixty seven Chains to a spruce tree standing on the western side of the Antirecolonial Railway and Reservation aforesaid and thence along the same north seven degrees and thirty minutes west fifteen Chains to the place of beginning containing one Hundred Acres more or less and distinguished as lot number One Hundred and two north of Kouchibouguac River

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining; except and reserved, nevertheless, out of this Present Grant, to Us, Our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances, (except before excepted) unto the said Federick Johnson his Heirs and Assigns, for ever. PROVIDED ALWAYS, and this present Grant is upon condition, that the same Grant be registered in the Secretary's Office of Our said Province of New Brunswick, to which Registry shall be attached a Duplicate of the Plan hereunto annexed.
