QUEEN, Defender of the Faith, &c. To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That We, of Our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do, by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

Damius Gogou his Heirs and Assigns,  
two Tracts of Land situate in the Parish of Nelson  
in the County of Northumberland in Our Province  
of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:—

The First Tract.

Beginning at a spruce tree standing on the south east side of the Settlement road at the most northern angle of lot number twenty five in Rogerville Settlement thence running by the magnet south forty degrees east sixty seven chains thence north thirty degrees east fifteen chains and fifty links thence north forty degrees west sixty seven chains to a maple tree standing on the south east side of the aforesaid settlement road and thence along the same south thirty degrees west fifteen chains and fifty links to the place of beginning, Containing one Hundred acres more or less and distinguished as the First Tract lot number twenty six in Rogerville. The Second Tract. Beginning at a maple tree standing on the south eastern side of the Settlement road at the most northern angle of lot number thirty purchased by Calisto Landry in Rogerville Settlement, thence running by the magnet south forty degrees east sixty seven chains thence north thirty degrees east fifteen chains and fifty links thence north forty degrees west sixty seven chains to a stake standing on the south eastern side of the settlement road above mentioned and thence along the same south thirty degrees west fifteen chains and fifty links to the place of beginning Containing one Hundred acres more or less and distinguished as the second tract lot number thirty one in Rogerville Settlement. The two tracts containing together two hundred acres more or less

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining; except and reserved, nevertheless, out of this Present Grant, to Us, Our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said

tracts of Land, and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances, (except before excepted) unto the said Damius Gogou his Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER.
