KNOW YE, That We, of Our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do, by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

Louis St. Babenot his
two Tract of Land situate in the Parish of *Cavetton*

Heirs and Assigns,

in the

County of

Kings

in Our Province of New Brunswick,

and bounded as follows, to-wit: *The First Tract, Beginning at a tree*

Standing at the south east angle of lot number thirty in Tweedie's Brook Settlement on the western side of a reserved road there running by the magnet north eighty six degrees and thirty minutes west sixty chains, thence south three degrees and thirty minutes west sixteen chains and sixty seven links thence south eighty six degrees and thirty minutes east sixty chains to a spruce tree standing on the western side of the aforesaid reserved road and thence along the same north three degrees and thirty minutes east sixteen chains and sixty seven links to the place of beginning. Containing One Hundred acres more or less and distinguished as the first Tract lot number thirty one in Tweedie's Brook Settlement. The second Tract Beginning at a tree standing on the eastern side of a reserved road at the south east angle of lot number thirty two located to Marc Babenot in Tweedie's Brook Settlement there running by the magnet north eighty six degrees and thirty minutes west forty chains, thence south three degrees and thirty minutes west sixteen chains and sixty seven links thence south eighty six degrees and thirty minutes east sixty chains to a take standing on the western side of the aforesaid reserved road and thence along the same north three degrees and thirty minutes east sixteen chains and sixty seven links to the place of beginning containing One Hundred acres more or less and distinguished as lot number thirty three (the second Tract) in Tweedie's Brook Settlement.
