R. D. Wilmot Victoria, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland,
QUEEN, Defender of the Faith, &c. To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That We, of Our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do, by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

John Dowling his Heirs and Assigns,
a Tract of Land situate in the Parish of Acadville in the
County of Kent in Our Province of New Brunswick,

and bounded as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a fir tree

standing on the southern side of the
Settlement road at the north west angle
of lot number one hundred and two
located to Matthew Moray in Acadville
Settlement thence running by the magnet
south three degrees and thirty minutes
west twenty two Chains to the northern
bank or shore of Kouchibouguac River
thence along the same following the
several courses thereof up stream in
a westerly direction with a rectangular
distance of thirteen Chains and fifty links
from last mentioned line thence north
three degrees and thirty minutes east
twenty three Chains to a birch tree standing
on the southern side of the aforesaid settle-
ment road and thence along the same south
eighty six degrees and thirty minutes east
thirteen Chains and fifty links to the place
of beginning containing sixty five Acres more
or less and distinguished as lot number one
hundred and eleven in Acadville Settlement

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining; except and reserved, nevertheless, out of this present Grant, to Us, Our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land,

and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances, (except before excepted), unto the said John Dowling his Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER.

PROVIDED ALWAYS, and this present Grant is upon condition, that the same Grant be Registered in the Secretary's Office of Our said Province of New Brunswick, to which Registry shall be attached a duplicate of the Plan hereunto annexed.
