KNOW YE, That We, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do by these Presents for Us, our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

John B. Collet his Heirs and Assigns,

Tract of Land situate in the Parish of *Acadivilla*

in the County of *Haut*

in our Province

of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to-wit:—

Beginning at a stake

standing at the north eastern angle of lot number fifty granted to Charles Richard in the South East Rogerville Settlement, thence running by the magnet South sixty nine degrees and thirty minutes East twelve chains & fifty links to a furrow, thence South twenty degrees West eighty chains to a cedar tree, thence North seventy degrees West twelve chains & fifty links to a stake, and thence North twenty degrees East eighty chains to the place of beginning

Containing one hundred acres more or less and distinguished as lot number fifty one in the South East Rogerville Settlement

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining; except and reserved, nevertheless, out of this present Grant, to Us, our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *tract* of Land and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances, (except before excepted) unto the said

John B. Collet his Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER.

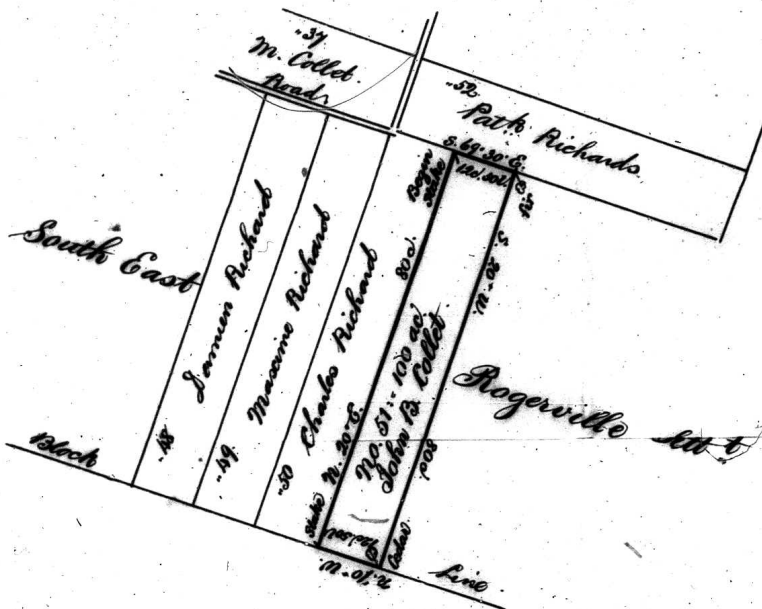
