VICTORIA, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland,
Queen, Defender of the Faith, &c. To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE, That We, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given
and granted, and We do by these Presents for Us, our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

Charles Ouellet his Heirs and Assigns,

Tract of Land situate in the Parish of *Acadewille*
in the County of *Acadie* in our Province

of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:—

Beginning at a point on the easterly line of lot letter F. purchased by Melanck Daigle on the northern side of Kouchibouguac River above McEanes Brook distant one Chain measured on a course by the Magnet north three degrees and twenty minutes east from a post standing on the northern side of the said Kouchibouguac River thence from the said point north three degrees and twenty minutes east sixty eight Chains and fifty links to a stake thence south eighty six degrees and forty minutes east fifteen Chains to another stake thence south three degrees and twenty minutes west sixty three Chains to a point distant one Chain northerly of the northern bank or shore of the Kouchibouguac River aforesaid, and thence following parallel to the said bank or shore maintaining the distance of one Chain therefrom in a westerly direction to the place of beginning. Containing One Hundred Acres more or less, and distinguished as lot letter K. north of Kouchibouguac River above McEanes Brook

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining; except and reserved, nevertheless, out of this present Grant, to Us, our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *tract* of Land and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances, (except before excepted) unto the said

Charles Ouellet his Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER.

PROVIDED ALWAYS, and this present Grant is upon condition, that the same Grant be Registered in the Secretary's Office of our said Province of New Brunswick, to which Registry shall be attached a duplicate of the Plan hereunto annexed.
