W. D. C. Cleland KNOW YE, That We, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do, by these Presents for Us, our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

Jude W. Poucher his Heirs and Assigns,
or Tract of Land situate in the Parish of *Acadieville*
in the County of *Brent* in our Province-

of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:

Beginning it at a post standing on the South-eastern side of the said Road from Woodville to Acadieville at the most western angle of lot Number One hundred and thirty four Surveyed for John Murray: North of Acadieville Settlement, thence running by the maine of the year 1797: South forty nine degrees and thirty minutes East thirty five chains and fifteen inches to another post, thence South four degrees West twenty four chains to another post, thence South forty degrees and thirty minutes East sixty two links of another post. Thence North forty nine degrees and thirty minutes West forty nine chains to another post standing on the South-eastern side of the said Road from Woodville to Acadieville aforesaid and hence along the same for the forty degrees and thirty minutes East twenty chains to the place of beginning.

Containing Eighty three acres, more or less, and distinguished as lot number One Hundred and thirty four, of Acadieville Settlement.
