KNOW YE, That We, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do, by these Presents for Us, our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

Maxime Votour, his

Heirs and Assigns,

a Tract of Land situate in the Parish of Acadieville

in the County of Kent

in our Province

of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a Post standing at the North-western angle of Lot Number One Hundred and Sixty-one hundred or Frank Sullivan in Acadieville Settlement thence running by the Magnet of the earth South twenty-one degrees and fifteen minutes West sixty-eight chains to another Post, thence North sixty-eight degrees and forty-five minutes East fifteen chains to another Post standing on the Western side of a Reserved Road, thence North twenty-one degrees and fifteen minutes East sixty-eight chains to another Post; and thence South sixteen degrees and forty-five minutes East fifteen chains to the place of beginning;

Excepting all that Part of the Settlement and Reserved roads running through the above described Tract.

Containing One Hundred Acres, more or less, and distinguished as Lot Number One Hundred and Sixty Acadieville Settlement.
