in the County of *Northumberland* & *Kent*,
of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a stake standing on
the Western side of a Reserved Road at the North eastern angle of Lot
Number Nine granted to August Robichaud in Richard Settlement;
thence running by the magnet of the year 1800, North sixty-nine degrees
and thirty minutes West sixty chains; thence North twenty degrees
and thirty minutes East fifteen chains; thence South sixty-nine degrees
and thirty minutes East six chains to a spruce tree standing on the
Western side of the Reserved Road aforesaid, and thence along the
same South twenty degrees and thirty minutes West fifteen chains
to the place of beginning.

Containing ~~Acre~~ Acres, more or less,
and distinguished as Lot Number Eleven in Richard Settlement;

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits,
commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining; except


