Edward VII., by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, etc. To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING: KNOW YE, That We, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given and granted, and We do, by these Presents for Us, our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

J. Snowball
Arthur Urquhart his Heirs and Assigns,

a Tract of Land, situate in the Parish of *Acadieville* in the County of *Rent* in our Province

of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a stake standing on the Eastern side of the Intercolonial Railway and Reservation at the South-west angle of Lot Number One Hundred and Sixteen South granted to J. Nelson Price North of Acadieville; thence running by the magnet of the year 1879 South eight-seven degrees East fifty-nine chains; thence South three degrees West seventeen chains to another stake; thence North eighty-seven degrees West fifty-five chains to another stake standing on the Eastern side of the Intercolonial Railway and Reservation aforesaid, and thence along the same in a North-westerly direction, with a rectangular distance of seventeen chains to the place of beginning. Containing Ninety-six Acres, more or less, and distinguished as Lot Number One Hundred and Fifteen North of Acadieville

also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining; except reserved, nevertheless, out of this present Grant, to Us, our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold Silver, and other Mines and Minerals; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *Tract* of Land all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances (except before excepted), unto the said *Arthur Urquhart*, his Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER.

PROVIDED ALWAYS, and this present Grant is upon condition, that the same Grant be Registered in the Secretary's Office of our said Province of New Brunswick, to which Registry shall be attached a duplicate of the hereunto annexed.

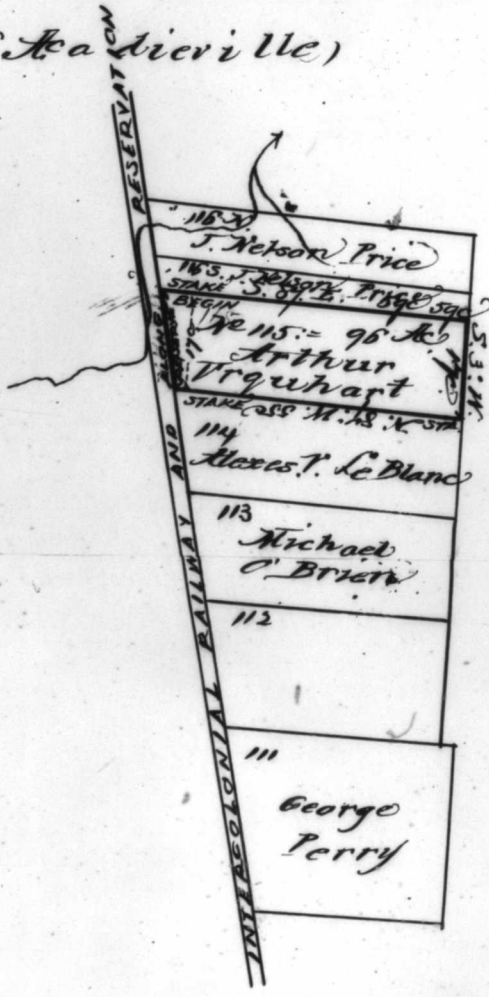
