King, Defender of the Faith, etc. To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:  
KNOW YE, That We, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given  
and granted, and We do, by these Presents for Us, our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

*John Cawse* his Heirs and Assigns,  
Tract of Land situate in the Parish of *Rogerville*  
in the County of *Carthumberland* in our Province

of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning at a post standing on the  
northern side of the Young settlement road at the South end of lot number one  
marked and every lot surveyed for habitation since  
running by the map of the year 1851 north forty five minutes west fifteen  
chain; back north eighty seven degrees and fifteen minutes east twenty chain; stand with full  
post marked east fifteen minutes east twenty chain; stand with full  
post marked east fifteen minutes east twenty chain to another post standing on the northern side of the Young  
settlement road opposite and here along the same south eighty seven degrees and fifteen  
minutes west twenty chain to the place of beginning. Containing one hundred acres more  
or less and being situated in lot number one hundred and sixty two Young settlement.

commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining; except

and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances (except before excepted,) unto the said

*John Cawse* his Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER.

Secretary's Office of our said Province of New Brunswick, to which Registry shall be attached a duplicate of the  
Plan hereunto annexed.
