King, Defender of the Faith, etc. To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE, That We, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given
and granted, and We do, by these Presents for Us, our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

J. B. Snowball
Frederick Sordage, his Heirs and Assigns,

a Tract of Land situate in the Parish of *Acadieville*

in the County of *Kent*

in our Province

of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a stake standing at the North-west angle of Lot Number One Hundred and Eighteen, surveyed for Noelm Robert, in the Second Tier, South of Nouvelle-Boulogne River; thence running by the magnet of the year 1903 South three degrees and thirty minutes West fifty-eight chains and sixteen links, crossing Acadieville Road, in that distance, to a stake and dry pine; thence North eighty-six degrees and thirty minutes West, seventeen chains and thirty-one links to another stake; thence North three degrees and thirty minutes East sixty-three chains and fifty links re-crossing Acadieville Road in that distance, to a stake; thence South sixty-nine degrees East, seventeen chains and sixty-five links to the place of beginning, Reserving nevertheless from the above described tract, the Acadieville Road so called.

Containing One Hundred Acres, more or less, and distinguished as Lot Number One Hundred and Seventeen, in Tier Two, South of Nouvelle-Boulogne River,

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining; except and reserved, nevertheless, out of this present Grant, to Us, our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *Tract* of Land and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances (except before excepted,) unto the said *Frederick Sordage,* his Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER. PROVIDED ALWAYS, and this present Grant is upon condition, that the same Grant be Registered in the Secretary's Office of our said Province of New Brunswick, to which Registry shall be attached a duplicate of the Plan hereunto annexed.

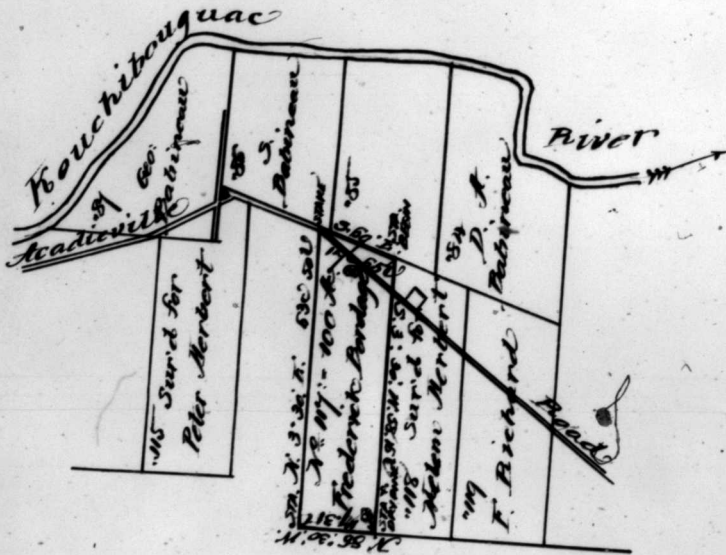
