Beginning at a point on the western side line of lot number fifty-nine in Bois settlement distant on a course south four degrees west one chain from a post standing on the southern bank or shore of Kouchibouguac river thence from said point south four degrees west sixty-four chains to a post standing on the northern side of a settlement road thence along the same south seventy-seven degrees and thirty minutes west fifteen chains and twenty links to another post thence north four degrees east sixty-seven chains or to a point distant one chain southerly from a post standing on the southern bank or shore of Kouchibouguac river aforesaid and thence in an easterly direction pursuing a width of one chain from the southern bank or shore of Kouchibouguac river aforesaid to the place of beginning.

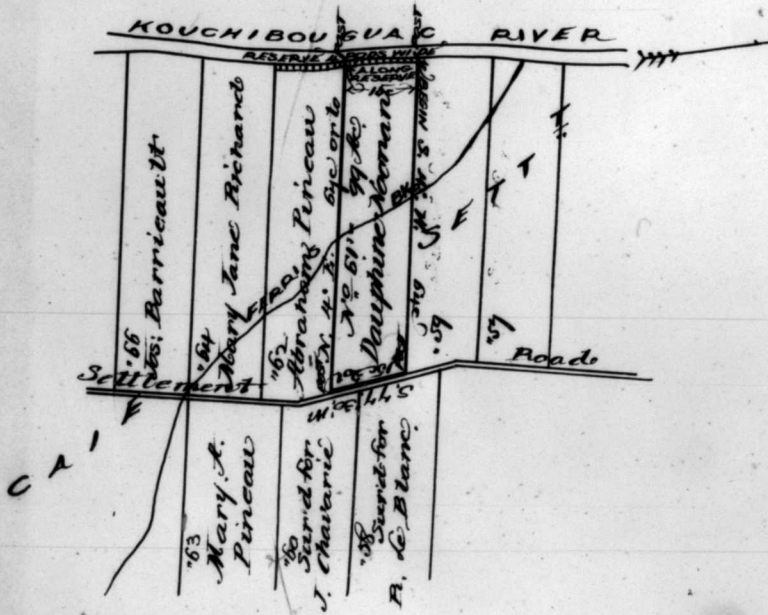
