KNOW YE, That We, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given
and granted, and We do, by these Presents for Us, our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

Orelia Martin

her Heirs and Assigns,

a Tract of Land situate in the Parish of *Acadiville*
in the County of *Kent.*

in our Province

of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a stake standing at the South east angle of Lot number One hundred and sixty, granted to Maxime Tolour, in the Acadiville Settlement, thence running by the magnet of the year 1898, twenty-one degrees and fifteen minutes East sixty-eight chains to another stake, thence South sixty-eight degrees and forty-four minutes East fifteen chains to another stake, thence South twenty-one degrees and fifteen minutes West sixty-eight chains to another stake, and thence North sixty-eight degrees and forty-four minutes West fifteen chains to the place of Beginning. Excepting all that part of the Settlement Road running through the above described tract.

Containing One hundred acres, more or less, and distinguished as lot number One hundred and sixty-one, in the Acadiville Settlement.

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining; except and reserved, nevertheless, out of this present Grant, to Us, our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *tract* of Land and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances (except before excepted,) unto the said *Orelia Martin* her Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER.

PROVIDED ALWAYS, and this present Grant is upon condition, that the same Grant be Registered in the Secretary's Office of our said Province of New Brunswick, to which Registry shall be attached a duplicate of the Plan hereunto annexed.

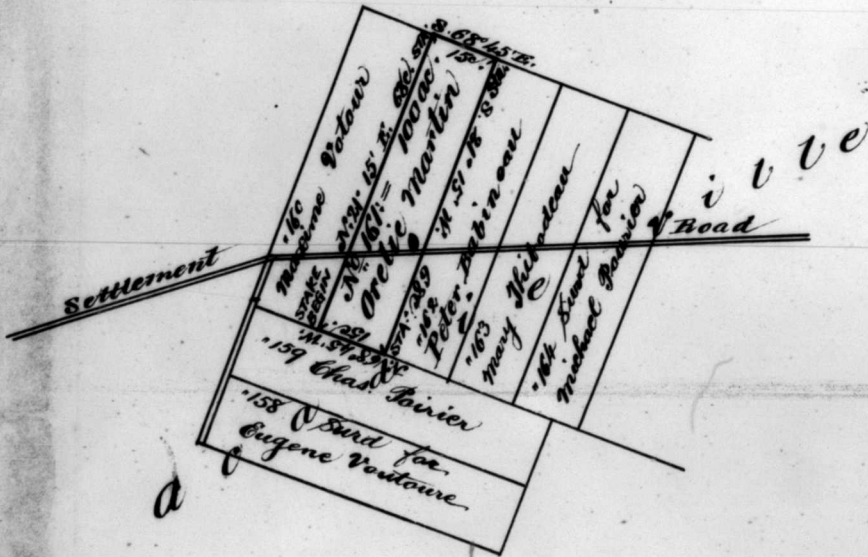
