King, Defender of the Faith, etc. To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:
KNOW YE, That We, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, have given
and granted and We do, by these Presents for Us, our Heirs and Successors, give and grant unto

Urbain Le Blanc, his Heirs and Assigns,

a Tract of Land situate in the Parish of *Acadieville*

in the County of *Kent* in our Province

of New Brunswick, and bounded as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a point distant one chain measured on a course by the magnet of the year 1896 South four degrees West from the Southern bank or shore of Kouchibouguais River, the said point being at the North-west angle of Lot Number Sixty-six, granted to Joseph Parreault, in the Caie Settlement; thence running South four degrees West, sixty-seven chains to the Northern side of the Settlement Road; thence along the same North eighty-six degrees West, fifteen chains to another stake; thence North four degrees East sixty-nine chains or to a point distant one chain Southward of the Southern bank or shore of Kouchibouguais River aforesaid; thence following parallel to the said bank or shore, maintaining a distance of one chain therefrom in an Easterly direction to the place of Beginning.

Containing One Hundred Acres, more or less, and distinguished as Lot Number Sixty-seven, in the Caie Settlement,

and also particularly described or marked on the Plot or Plan of Survey hereunto annexed; together with all profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining; except and reserved, nevertheless, out of this present Grant, to Us, our Heirs and Successors, all Coals, and also all Gold and Silver, and other Mines and Minerals; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *Tract* of Land and all and singular the Premises hereby granted, with their appurtenances (except before excepted,) unto the said *Urbain Le Blanc,* his Heirs and Assigns, FOR EVER.

PROVIDED ALWAYS, and this present Grant is upon condition, that the same Grant be Registered in the Secretary's Office of our said Province of New Brunswick, to which Registry shall be attached a duplicate of the Plan hereunto annexed.

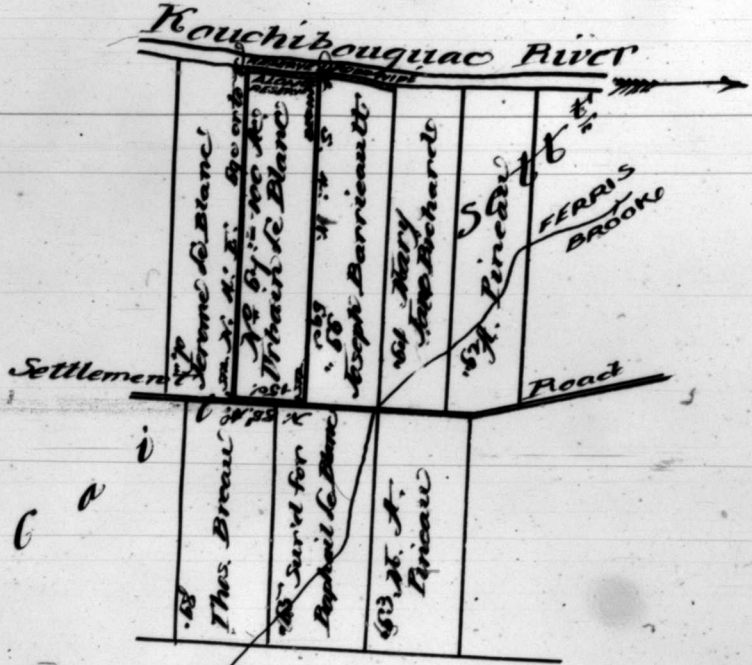
